1. Ice Cream Cone Suncatchers



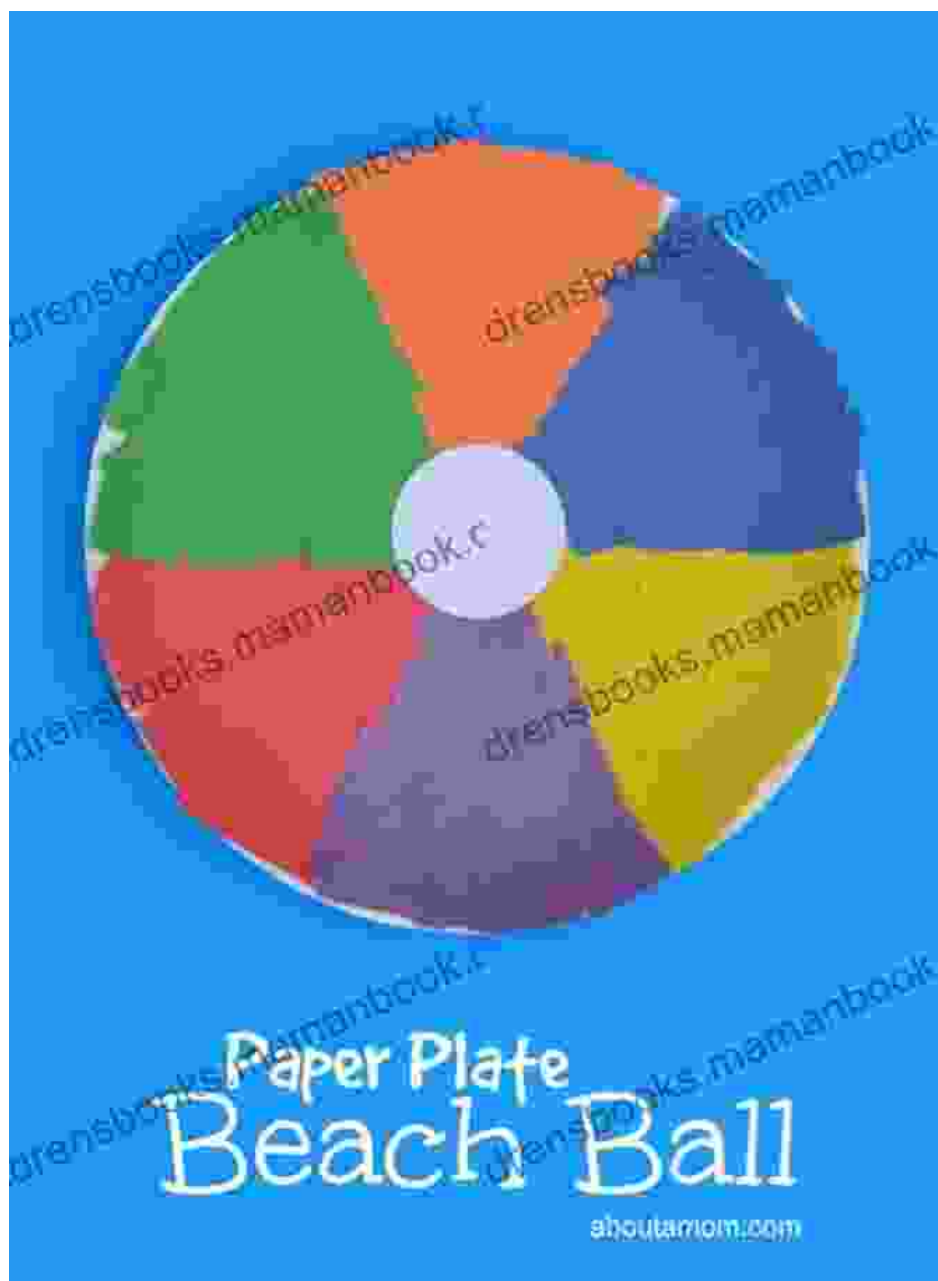
These ice cream cone suncatchers are a fun and easy way to add some summery cheer to your windows. To make them, you'll need:
