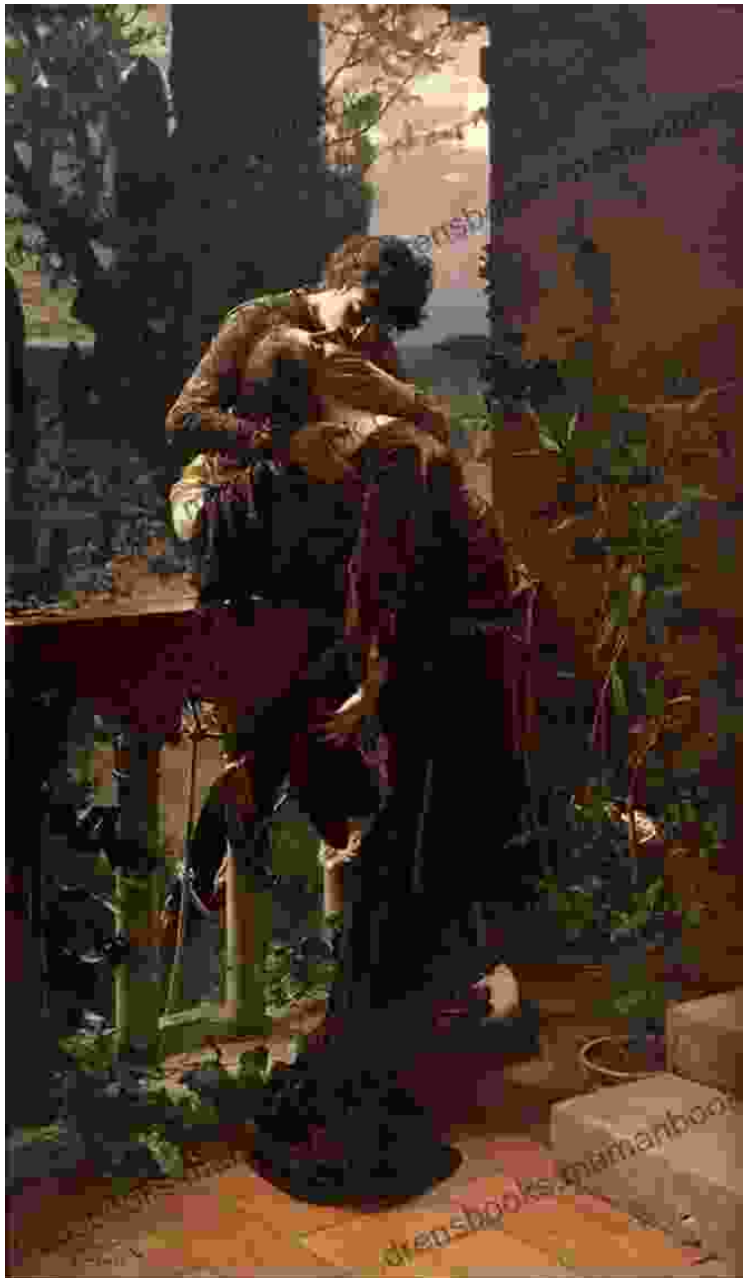


Ariette from Romeo and Juliet "Je Veux Vivre": A Clarinet Quartet Masterpiece
