## Trousers

Cast on 32 stitches with the larger needles. Knit the waistbands, then divide the stitches for the legs. Work in stocking stitch, shaping the gusset for a comfortable fit. Knit the legs to the desired length and finish with a simple bind-off.

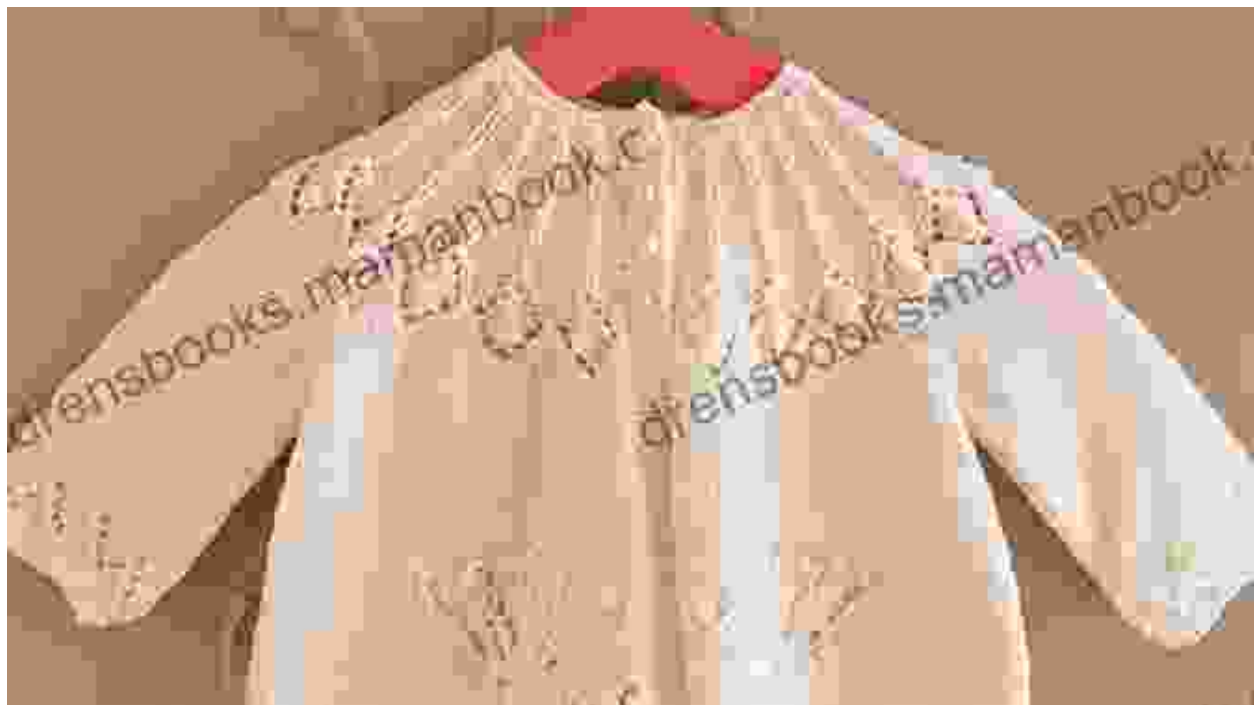

# How to Knit

Knit one stitch with **knit** and **purl** stitches, and when adding stitches in your work.



- 1** Make a loop on the needle. Hold the needle in your right hand, with the yarn in your left hand. Wrap the yarn around the needle.
- 2** Move the yarn to the back. Hold the needle in your right hand, with the yarn in your left hand. Wrap the yarn around the needle.
- 3** Insert the needle into the loop. Hold the needle in your right hand, with the yarn in your left hand. Insert the needle into the loop.
- 4** Pull the needle through the loop. Hold the needle in your right hand, with the yarn in your left hand. Pull the needle through the loop.

To make purl stitches, just reverse the action of plain knit stitches.

**KNIT ONE** Finish off your knitting with the straight-forward cast-off technique.



- 1** Knit two stitches. Hold the needle in your right hand, with the yarn in your left hand. Knit two stitches.
- 2** Knit the last stitch. Hold the needle in your right hand, with the yarn in your left hand. Knit the last stitch.
- 3** Pull the needle through the loop. Hold the needle in your right hand, with the yarn in your left hand. Pull the needle through the loop.
- 4** Cut the yarn. Hold the needle in your right hand, with the yarn in your left hand. Cut the yarn.



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
