
Richard Harding Davis: The Boy Scout Who Became a War Correspondent and Author

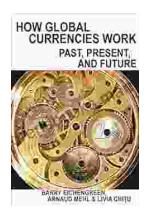
