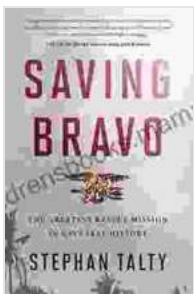


# The Greatest Rescue Mission in Navy SEAL History: Operation Neptune Spear

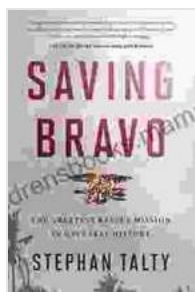
The SEALs who participated in Operation Neptune Spear were awarded numerous commendations and medals for their bravery and
